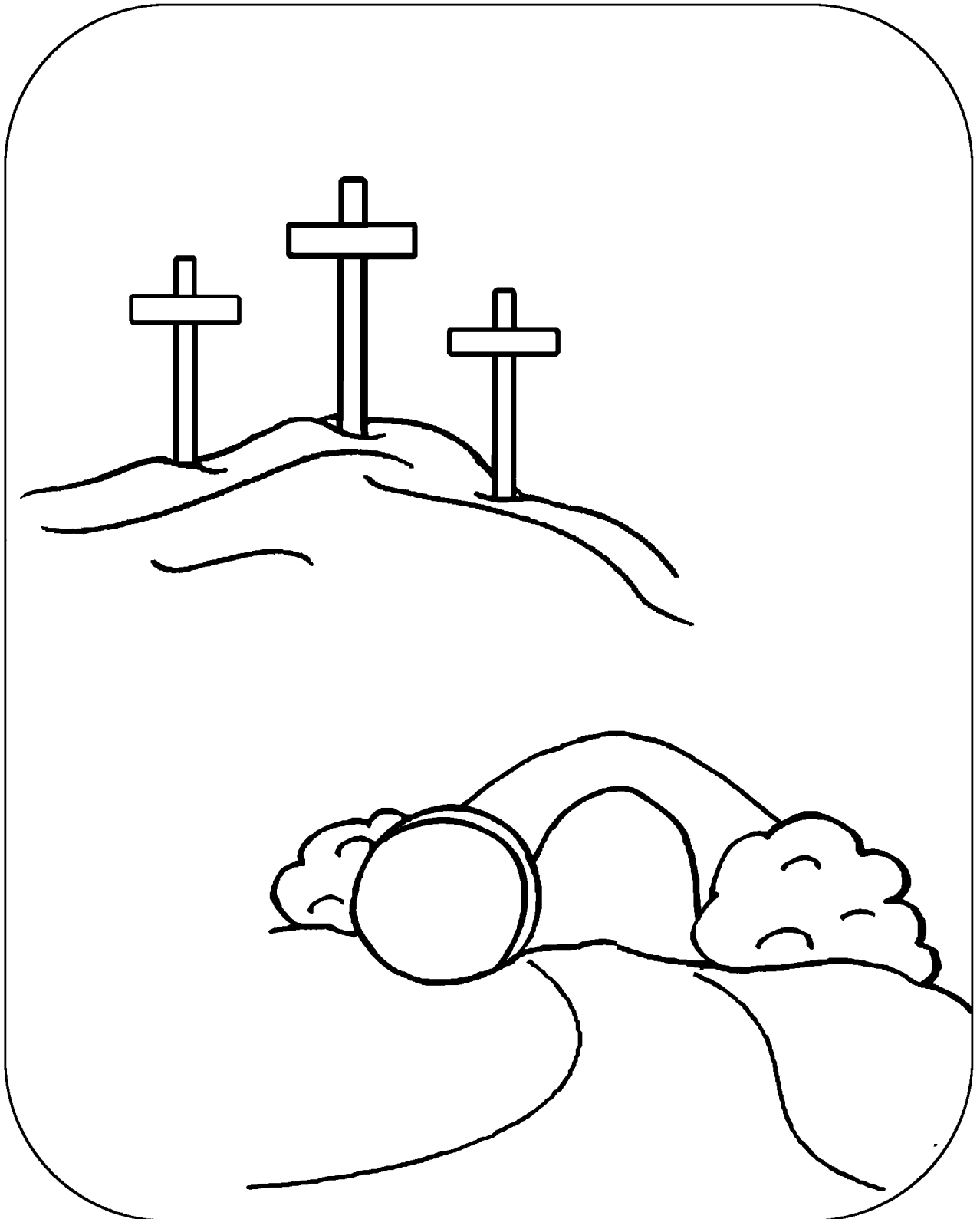


God's Lamb Dies and Lives Again



*And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering oftentimes the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins:
But this man, after he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever,
sat down on the right hand of God ... Hebrews 10:11-12*

God's Lamb Dies and Lives Again

Jesus Christ, the Great High Priest, presented the final sacrifice with His **own** blood. In Luke 23:46 Jesus said, "Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit." This Lamb of God laid down His own life. Jesus made His sacrifice **once**. That was enough. In John 19:30 Jesus said, "It is finished!"

When Jesus finished the work on the cross, the **veil** of the temple was torn in two by God. Jesus had fulfilled the Law and the Prophets as He said He would do in Matthew 5:17. No longer would God need to look at the Law through the blood of lambs each year on the Day of Atonement.

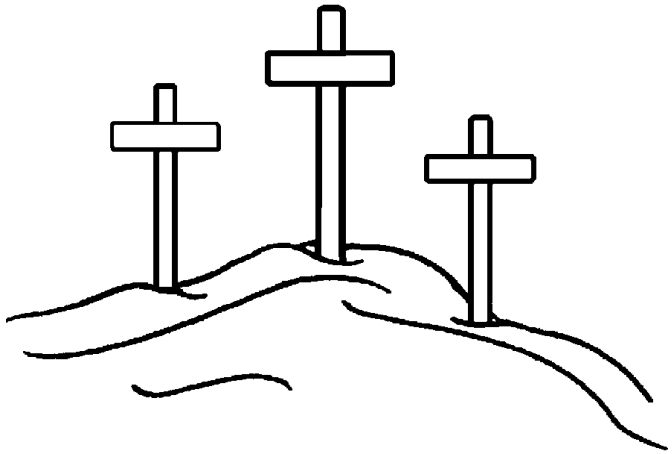
God did not want sacrifices because He had no pleasure in those things. Neither the sacrifices nor the priests were sinless. But Jesus was sinless, and His sacrifice was enough. The law of the Old Testament could not make any person free from sin. It could only point out that there was **sin**. However, Christ can free us from sin.

Jesus did not remain in the grave. He rose again victorious over sin and death. Never before had a lamb risen again. Jesus became the final covering for sin. And Jesus Christ can be our covering if we allow Him to do so. After Jesus went back to heaven, He sat down at the right hand of God.

There was no place for the priests to sit down because they had to keep making sacrifices. Their job was never finished.

There is forgiveness and no more offering for sin. We can draw near to God and have our hearts sprinkled **clean** from an evil conscience. We can accept His **free** gift for cleansing from sin. And we should encourage one another to do good deeds and meet together regularly. There are no other sacrifices, but there will be punishment for those who reject Christ. The **LORD** will **judge** His people.

It will only be a little while before Christ returns. Acts 1:11 says that Jesus will come back the same way that they had watched Him go into heaven. John 14:2-3 says that Jesus has gone to prepare a **place** for us. He will return to take His own to be with Him. We can be ready.

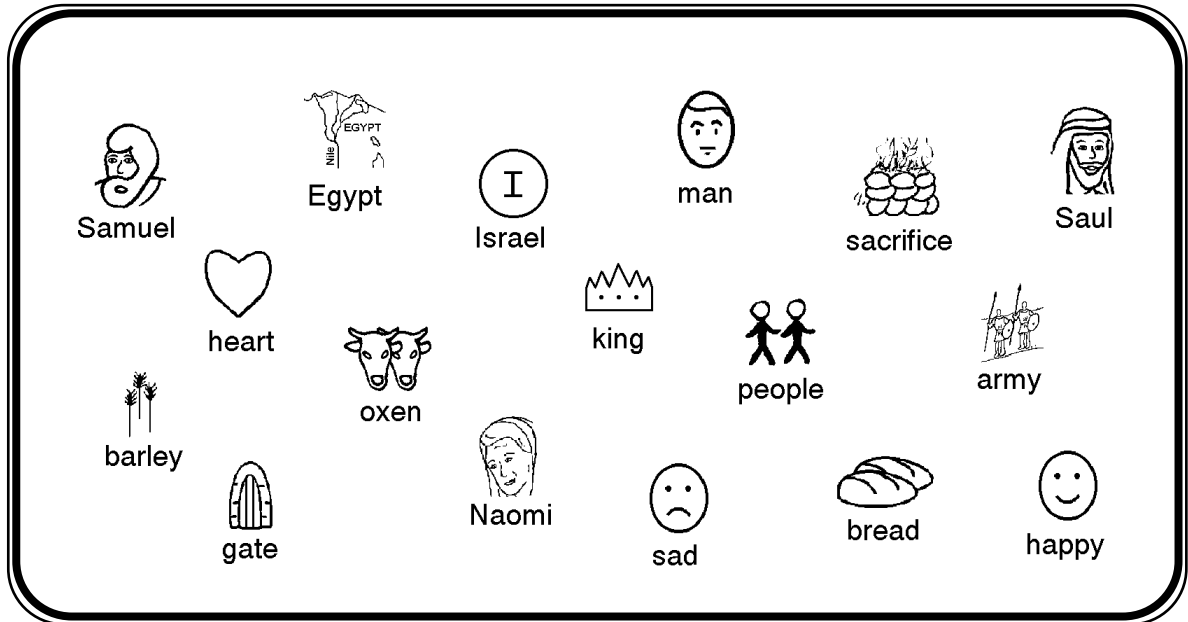

DAY 2 BIBLE VERSE: *1 Samuel 15:22-23* Trace and answer.

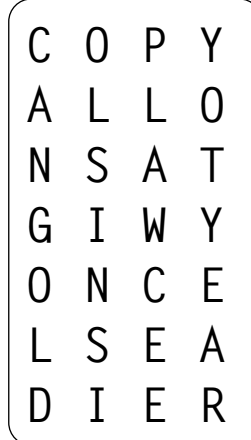
